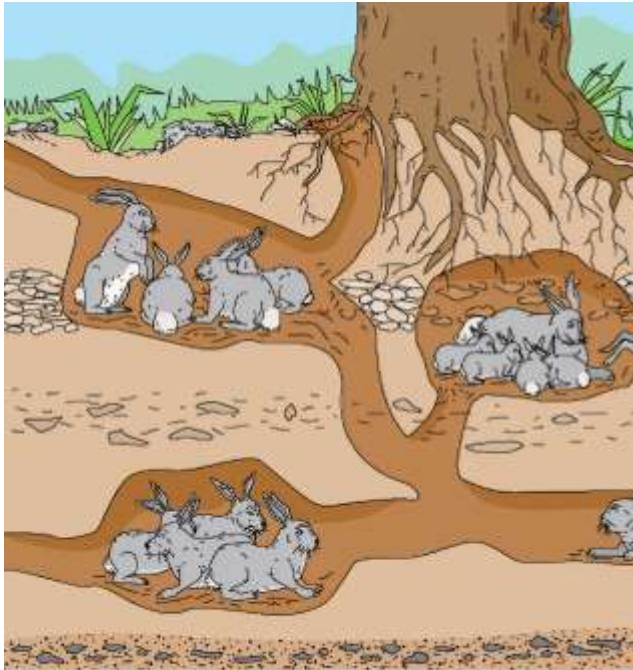


# The Soft Survivor

The European Rabbit habitats are generally, tropical savannahs and woodlands, with secure refuges such as: hollow tree trunks and burros.

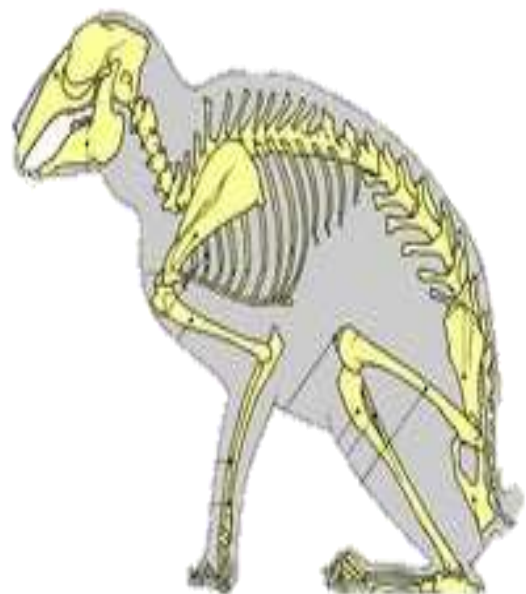
